COURSE SUMMARY	<p>The Course in Ear Canal Micro Suction is designed to provide students with the knowledge and skills to provide management strategies, recognise complications and risks associated with microsuction and identify referral pathways for specialist care in relation to a range of conditions associated with microsuction, based on detailed pre-requisite knowledge of the anatomy, physiology and pathophysiology of the auditory system.</p> <p>This program is part of the second level in The Benchmark Group's ear health learning pathway. Students must complete the Foundations of Ear Health Program prior to entry to this course.</p>

Course outline

The Course in Ear Canal Micro Suction is designed to provide students with the knowledge and skills to provide management strategies, recognise complications and risks associated with microsuction and identify referral pathways for specialist care in relation to a range of conditions associated with microsuction, based on detailed pre-requisite knowledge of the anatomy, physiology and pathophysiology of the auditory system.

Vocational outcomes include:

- Enhanced clinical practice
- Addition of skills to scope of practice
- Ear health assessment clinical skills.

Specialist skills:

- Point of care hearing assessment
- Otoscopy
- Wax removal by microsuction

Course outcome

On the successful completion of the program, students should have the skills and knowledge to:

- Assess and determine factors that affect ear and hearing health in relation to microsuction, assess the client's physical and pathophysiological auditory status and seek advice where appropriate
- Perform ear canal micro suctioning procedures when deemed appropriate and safe.

Course content

The face-to-face workshop involves anatomy refresher, principles of microsuction and practical activities including condition recognition, ear health assessment, monocular otoscopy, digital video otoscopy, and microsuction techniques for wax removal.

Students work with peers in the classroom to conduct simulated examination as part of the practical skills activities.

All irrigation practice and assessments are performed on a mannequin, and the workshop focuses on wax removal using irrigation including the legal and consent issues involving ear irrigation.

Course structure

To achieve competency students must demonstrate successful completion of:

- Written assessment covering essential knowledge and skills
- Realistic skills simulations and oral questioning in the classroom including 'What if and how to' scenarios
- Workplace observed practice.

Workplace observed practice is a mandatory requirement for this course, workplace practice must be observed by a medical practitioner, practice manager or practice nurse that performs the identified workplace tasks as part of their role.

All workplace activities must be completed in accordance with work health and safety.

Course entry requirements

Entrants must provide evidence of a relevant professional role. Relevant roles would include:

- Registered and Enrolled Nurses
- Allied Health Professionals E.g. Audiologists
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health Care Practitioners and Workers
- General Practitioners.

Entrants should have:

- A minimum of six months' employment or experience working with clients in a clinical environment
- High language, literacy and numeracy levels. Sufficient to interpret medical documents/referrals/ requests and write medical notes and reports.

Benchmark Group Specific Requirements

Students must hold the unit EHHPEH002 Promote, educate and manage ear health unit from the Foundations of Ear Health Program.

Ear Health learning pathway

Learning pathways is a new approach where we are giving the control of your learning journey back to you, the student.

The underlying rationale recognises that students are better able to learn when they can control the flow of their experience, or when their learning is self-directed.

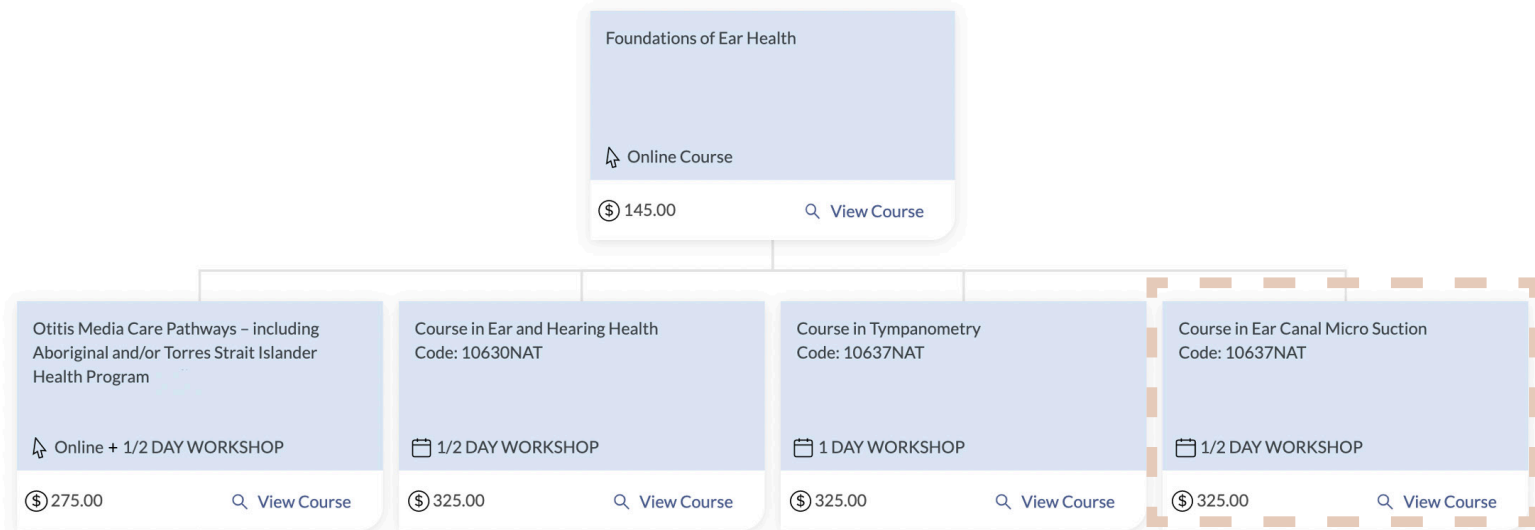
A self-directed model of delivery allows access to a broader range of students regardless of geographic location and allows people to complete the program at a pace that suits their current lifestyle and workplace balance.
